Print Awareness

It's time for our next early literacy chat! In the last *Check It Out*, I covered print motivation and simple tips for helping your children to read. The next early literacy skill I'll discuss is print awareness.

To recap, print motivation is your child's interest in and love of books. If your child loves reading, you have print motivation down pat. Print awareness, however, is understanding how a book works. When a child's print awareness is well developed, they understand:

- We read from top to bottom and left to right;
- Books have a front cover, back cover and title pages;
- Different books have different purposes (ex: non-fiction books are true, fiction books are stories, cookbooks help you cook, picture books are fun to read on mom or dad's lap, etc.);
- Books have a beginning, middle and end;
- Books have authors that write the words and sometimes illustrators that draw the pictures;
- Print has meaning; it's not just a bunch of marks on a page;
- How to turn one page at a time;
- How to care for a book and keep it from getting damaged.

This isn't an all-encompassing list, but it's a start. A child who has developed print awareness knows how to use books and understands the significance of print. They understand that those squiggly lines on the page have meaning, and when grown-ups read books we're reading the words, not the pictures.

There are so many easy ways to work on your child's print motivation every day. Here are some things to try:

- Be silly! When you sit down to read a book with your child, hold the book upside down and say, "That's funny, I can't read this book! Can you help me figure out what's wrong?"
- Read books that use words, signs, letters or writing as part of the illustrations. Some great examples are: *Bunny Cakes* by Rosemary Wells; *Click, Clack, Moo* by Doreen Cronin; *The Monster at the End of the Book* by Jon Stone; *No David* by David Shannon; *There are Cats in This Book* by Viviane Schwarz; and *Freight Train* by Donald Crews.
- Read a book with a repeated word or phrase. Teach your child the word or phrase and have them "read" it when you point to it.
- Occasionally point to the words you are reading. Pointing to words as we read them is called "print referencing." Studies have shown that kids who regularly read books with an adult utilizing print referencing are significantly more likely to be aware of print than kids who never experience print referencing. - Encourage your child to write and draw regularly. Writing is a natural extension of print awareness.
- Let your child explore age appropriate books independently. Let them turn the pages, give them access to books that they know well so they can "read" them to themselves.
- Let your child help you make a meal or snack using a printed recipe.

On the Move Cory Stutes, Local History Specialist

Moving an entire house is somewhat of a rare event these days. However, it used to be a fairly common practice to move houses to be reused elsewhere rather than be destroyed. Throughout Licking County, there are many buildings that have been moved from their original locations, sometimes more than once! Three of the most well-known houses that have been relocated are the Buckingham House, the Sherwood-Davidson House and the King House. The Licking County Historical Society owns and operates the Buckingham and Sherwood-Davidson Houses, which were originally both located on opposite sides of the former Carroll's Department Store on North Third Street. The King House, now home to the Heisey Museum, is currently in its third location! It originally sat on the northeast corner of the square, where the Licking County Foundation is now. When the Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Building was built, later called the Auditorium, the house was moved further north on Second Street. It was moved to its current location in Veterans' Park in 1974. Another well-known move was the relocation of the Davis-Shai house from its original location on Hebron Road to its current spot on Central Parkway behind Walmart in Heath.

More recently, the Captain Scott house near Alexandria was moved to spare it from the expansion of Route 161. The house was originally built in 1870 for Captain Joseph M. Scott, who was an abolitionist and Civil War captain. The feat was accomplished in 2007, saving the historic home from the wrecking ball.

One of the longest trips made by a Licking County home made occurred in 1903—a home known as Staselwood. The home was originally located near the current entrance to The Arcade on Fourth Street, next door to the imposing Smythe residence. Staselwood was relocated to Hickman Road just north of Hanover, where it sits today.

Unfortunately, some homes survived being moved only to face the wrecking ball years later. One such example was a sixteen-room brick mansion known as the Thomas Jefferson Davis home. The 250 ton home was moved one block from its original location, completely intact, in the 1930s. The home was built in 1850 on the southeast corner of Third and Locust Streets, which is now a parking lot. The building was relocated to 28 East Church Street, currently the site of the Second Presbyterian Church annex. Before it was demolished, the building was used as a doctor's office.

Granville has many buildings that have been moved, including the "Counting House," which houses Alfie's Wholesome Foods, a portion of the Welsh Hills School, and the Sinnet House, which is now located behind the Granville Post Office. Many private residences in the village have been relocated as well.

There is even a case of a Licking County school being moved. The school was located on Marion Road southwest of Homer in Bennington Township, between Bash Lane Road and Bennington Chapel Road. The location of the building was a point of contention between parents of the children who attended the school. Late one night, a group of men went to the schoolhouse, jacked it up, and took it away to their preferred location. The next morning, children went to school only to find that it wasn't there anymore! From that point on, the school became known as Runaway School.

DEAF HISTORY MONTH

March 13 - April 15

Licking County Library (LCL) is proud to honor Ohio Deaf History Month which became law with Governor Kasich's signature in December 2017. The formal education of the deaf began in the United States with the founding of the American School for the Deaf in 1817.

LCL has a wealth of resources to support deaf heritage and culture. A simple subject search of the online catalog brings up nearly 700 titles in a variety of formats. There are more than 200 eBooks and videos available on the Ohio Digital Library. These materials include information on American Sign Language, biographies and fiction featuring deaf characters.

The Main Library in downtown Newark features three quiet study rooms with videophone capabilities. A videophone is a device that transmits and receives visual images as well as sounds. This allows people who are deaf to use sign language to communicate with each other over the phone or communicte with other people who are utilizing a sign language interpreter.

Additionally, Miss Heidi, our new Youth Services Programming Librarian, will be incorporating basic signs into her story times to share this language with children and their families. Visit lickingcountylibrary.info to learn more.
