


Let's look back to the middle of the nineteenth century, specifically the 1850s. Newark was a young community, but was quickly laying the foundation for its own industrial revolution during the latter half of the century. The canal cut through Newark a block south of the square, and the Newark City School District had just been established in 1848.

To get even more specific, I'm going to take a look at the year 1853. That year was, in many ways, an advantageous year for the people of Newark. In January, the Central Ohio Railroad completed a connection between Newark and Columbus. Travel between the two cities could now be accomplished in as little as ninety minutes, leading to a new wave of commercial enterprise.

A market house was constructed at the northeast corner of West Main Street and Fourth Street. The contract for construction was made in January and projected to cost just over \$4,200. On November 30, 1853, the building opened to the public. In June of the following year, the city administration offices were moved to the upper floor

of the market house. This building served the community for a century as the home of Newark City Hall.

The event I want to focus on is another which took place in 1853. It was that year a beautifully detailed map of Newark was published. It includes illustrations of the third courthouse, as well as the newly-built market house. The map also includes a listing of business owners and the type of business they operated.

In 2006, we received an original copy of this map by bequest from local

In 2006, we received an original copy of this map by bequest from local historian William I. Davis. Mr. Davis spent many years working on a history of Newark from 1802 to 1900 and amassed an incredible collection of documents, pictures and artifacts. Along with the map, we received a wealth of research and materials from his estate including the unfinished manuscript of his book.

It is with unbridled excitement that I'm happy to announce that we recently completed a full restoration of Mr. Davis' map. It is one of only two known to exist and has never been published or reproduced to our knowledge. Extensive conservation work and framing was completed by the Intermuseum Conservation Association (ICA) in Cleveland, resulting in a truly amazing artifact. It's my honor to invite you for an official unveiling of this piece of local history on Thursday, September 27 at 6pm under the cupola at LCL's Downtown Newark location. In addition to the map, several items from Mr. Davis' collection will be on display for the very first time during the event. Please join us in being among the first to view this incredible local treasure!
