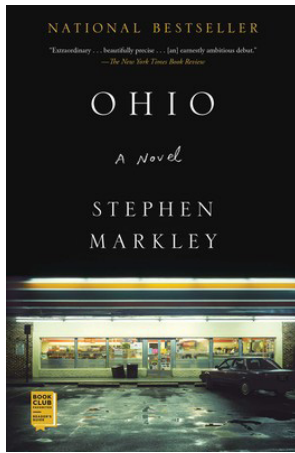

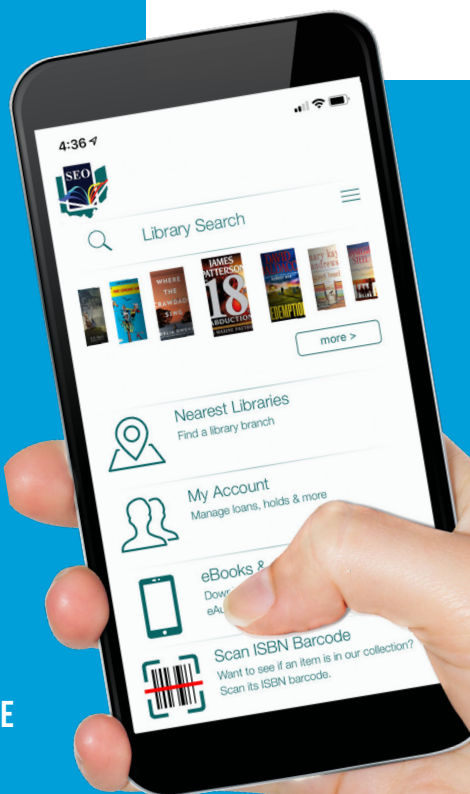

Wi-Fi hotspot lending and hotspot reservations are now available at Licking County Library! Patrons of LCL have the opportunity to either checkout or rent a portable Wi-Fi Hotspot. Choose the service that is right for you.

HOTSPOT LENDING: No immediate plans? Just like a book, you can request one of 16 circulating hotspots and take it home with you. However, if they are all currently checked out you can place a hold, adding your name to the waitlist. When a hotspot is returned, you are notified and you can pick it up at any of our locations. Hotspots available for lending can be borrowed, free for 28 days.

HOTSPOT RESERVATION: Need a hotspot for a specific date? Hotspot reservations allow you to tell us when you need the hotspot. It doesn't matter the reason—vacation, business meeting or other. Reserve a hotspot for a 2- or 4- week time frame, to have Wi-Fi access where and when you need it. Hotspot reservations can be placed for a small fee; 2 weeks for \$10 or 4 weeks for \$20.

In either lending instance, each hotspot can support up to 10 devices. Reservations can be made on our website at lickingcountylibrary.org, by calling 740.349.5500 or at any LCL location.

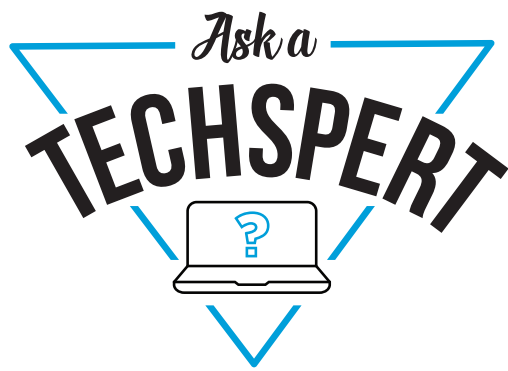
