Meet LCL's New Director!



Hello Friends, Neighbors and Community Members:

I am Susanne Sacchetti, the new Director of the Licking County Library. I began in my new position on April 12th, after moving here from New Jersey. Over the past few years, I have spent quite a bit of time in Licking County, visiting my partner—a long-time resident of Glenford and police officer in Columbus. Each time I visited, I fell more and more in love with your county. I am honored to now call Licking County my home and lead the library's wonderful team.

I bring with me extensive experience in both the education and library professions. Receiving my Masters in Library and Information Science from Drexel University in 2005, I first began my graduate studies in School and Public Librarianship at Rowan University. I have worked in a variety of library settings, including elementary school, academic and public libraries, in both virtual and physical environments.

I first entered the library profession in 2002, as an Associate Educational Media Specialist. I also bring with me experience at the college level, as a Library Specialist and then Reference Librarian, at the Atlantic Cape Community College, and briefly as an Online Librarian for the American Public University System. I also taught graduate-level library science courses, as an Online Adjunct Instructor, for Drexel University's iSchool.

I began my career in library administration as the Director of the Deptford Free Public Library in 2012. I often joke that I accidentally became a Library Director, as I initially interviewed for the Reference Librarian position with the Deptford Free Public Library. I went on to become the Director of the Cumberland County Library in 2017 and then the Executive Director of LibraryLinkNJ, New Jersey's statewide library cooperative.

I am passionate about building partnerships and collaborating with community organizations, local businesses, and schools. I've already had the pleasure of meeting with several of our county's school superintendents and am excited for the library to build upon its work with the schools, as well as the county's home-school community. I would love to see us work together to get a Licking County Library Card in the hands of every child.

While I am new to the area, I am vested in learning the varied and diverse needs of the townships, villages, and cities in Licking County. I look forward to exploring how the Licking County Library can build upon the exceptional service that it became known for under the leadership of former Library Director Babette Wofter, who retired in April.

We are at a unique time, coming out of the pandemic. It is a natural time for reflection and renewal. This offers us an opportunity to reevaluate the needs of our community and how the library can best meet those needs. The past year has not been easy for anyone. The Licking County Library is eager to establish new programs and services that will help our community move forward.

I am excited to be a part of your community, and I look forward to working with you, the library's talented team members, and its Board of Trustees to elevate library services in Licking County. I welcome everyone's return to each of our branches, and I look forward to meeting you at one of our upcoming meet-and-greet events.

Arrayed in their Sunday best were many prominent members of the Black community, among them teachers, entrepreneurs, artisans and war veterans. The oldest among them had lived in the time when slavery was legal in the United States, while the youngest would witness the era of Civil Rights and the movement for social justice. Redistricting 101: What It Is and Why It's Important Now October 7 | 5PM

Every ten years, based on the results of the US Census, Ohio legislators redraw the maps for US Congressional Districts, as well as for Ohio House and Senate districts, making adjustments to distribute population evenly. Laura Joseph, a board member of the Licking County League of Women Voters and volunteer for the Fair Districts Speakers Bureau, describes the process currently taking place, and in particular how redistricting reforms passed by Ohioans in 2015 and 2018 stand to reduce gerrymandering, restore representational fairness, and increase voters' influence on candidates. She also shares what actions Ohio residents are taking to influence how their communities are represented in the new maps and to keep legislators accountable.

Newark's Darkest Day: The Lynching of Carl Etherington • September 9 • 5:30 - 6:30pm

Carl Etherington's death certificate bluntly records the cause of death as "strangulation from being hanged by a mob." Seventeen-year-old Carl Etherington was lynched near the southeast corner of the Licking County Courthouse square on July 8, 1910. Historian Joe Tebben explores the lynching of Etherington and the "temporary insanity" and the circumstances surrounding a tragic day in Newark's history.
